Recovery Snapshot

Homeowners Assistance Program (Road Home)

The Road Home program provides compensation payments to homeowners affected by hurricanes Katrina and Rita across Louisiana

Administering Agency: OCD-DRU

Allocation: \$9.972 billion

Funding Provided: No more than \$150,000

National Objective(s): Benefit Citizens of Low-to-Moderate Income



Accomplishments

- As of April 1, 2015, 130,038 applicants have received \$9 billion in funding.
- The average award is \$69,214.
- 119,256 (92%) of the grantees chose to stay and rebuild in Louisiana.
 - Rebuilding resources provided to these applicants total more than \$8 billion.
- 54% of all Road Home dollars (\$4.86 billion) have been provided to 56,045 LMI households.
- A total of 32,397 Option 1 homeowners have received more \$943 million in incentive funds to elevate their homes.

General Information

This effort represents the **largest single housing recovery program in U.S. history**. Through the Road Home, eligible homeowners received up to \$150,000 in compensation for their losses to get them back into their homes. Homeowners could choose to stay in their homes and reoccupy (Option 1), establish another residency in Louisiana (Option 2) or sell their homes and not be a homeowner in Louisiana (Option 3). Program awards were made up of four main components: compensation grants, elevation incentives, additional compensation grants, and individual mitigation measures (IMM).
