# OCD-DRU – Expenditures

## **Katrina/Rita**

- Expended \$27,455,926 in July 2014
- As of July 31, 2014, 94.9% of all funds have been expended

## **Gustav/Ike**

- Expended \$18,594,010 in July 2014
- As of July 31, 2014, 56.3% of all funds have been expended

## **Isaac**

- Expended \$2,258,098 in July 2014
- Total expenditures of \$5,702,713 as of July 31, 2014
- Total allocation of \$64 million for state recovery

## Katrina/Rita Ninth Anniversary

- Expended almost **95%** of total Katrina/Rita CDBG-DR funding
  - \$11.5 billion – Housing
  - \$ 1.4 billion – Infrastructure
  - \$317 million – Economic Development
- Nearly **\$4.2 million** per day has been spent since the state's first Katrina/Rita funding allocation was approved on Apr. 11, 2006



# Katrina/Rita Ninth Anniversary

## Housing

- Of the 130,033 homeowners assisted through the Road Home, **56,019**, or 43%, are low- to moderate-income households
  - More than **53%** of all funds have gone to LMI households
- As of Aug. 8, 2014, the Louisiana Land Trust has put back into commerce or transferred to parish governments **10,497 of the 10,738 properties** they once held title to (97.7%)
- **8,538 units** rebuilt or repaired through the Small Rental Property Program, 7,597 of which offer affordable rents
  - New Orleans: **5,708 units**, 5,020 with affordable rents
- **60** Piggyback multi-family developments built
  - **7,098 total rental units**, 4,239 of which offer affordable rents
  - New Orleans: 33 developments, **4,508 total units** with 2,734 offering affordable rents



# Katrina/Rita Ninth Anniversary

## Infrastructure

- **Long Term Community Recovery:** \$521.8 million expended on 210 projects in 23 parishes
  - New Orleans: \$286.6 million invested in 96 projects
- **Local Government Infrastructure:** \$149.5 million expended on 42 projects
  - New Orleans: \$119.6 million invested in 17 projects
- **Primary and Secondary Education:** \$204.5 million expended on 78 projects in 15 parish school systems and the Recovery School District
  - New Orleans: \$96.4 million invested in 27 projects
- **Fisheries Infrastructure:** \$15.2 million expended for 22 projects in 10 parishes



# Katrina/Rita Ninth Anniversary

## Economic Development

Several programs have been completed:

- Provided grants and loans to **4,200 small business** (*Small Firm Recovery Loan and Grant*);
- More than **6,000 workers trained** and **2,786 directly placed in jobs** (*Recovery Workforce Training*);
- **\$28.4 million** flowed to 11 impacted parishes to promote tourism and culture (*Louisiana Tourism Marketing*);
- **380 research projects** supported and approximately **90** technology transfers, patents and licenses received (*Research Commercialization and Educational Enhancement*)

## Project-Based Recovery Opportunity Program

- Invested **\$29.8 million in 18 projects to date**, 17 in New Orleans

## Parish Recovery Program

Within 53 parishes:

- **356** infrastructure, housing and economic development **projects**
- **\$562.5 million** obligated
- **\$244.2 million** expended



*Sen. Landrieu joined city, parish and state officials for the groundbreaking of the Ferriday Water Treatment Plant in May. Concordia Parish has dedicated 60% of their Gustav-Ike Parish Recovery funds to this project.*



# Hurricane Isaac Recovery

## Partial Action Plan 3:

- Allocates **\$12,828,440** to Plaquemines Homeowner Assistance Program
  - Part of Plaquemines' overall allocation of \$16,953,000
  - Parish will run program
  - OCD-DRU and LHC to provide technical assistance
- **Public Comment Period** began Wednesday, Aug. 20; ends Tuesday, Sept. 2

# Recent/Upcoming Recovery Events

- Aug. 20, 2014:  
**New Orleans East Hospital Grand Opening**
  - \$52.4 million — K/R Long Term Community Recovery Program



*New Orleans East Hospital*

- Aug. 28, 2014: **Marais Apartments Grand Opening**
  - \$9.5 million — K/R Piggyback Program
  - 112 units, all at affordable rents (9 PSH units)
  - Part of the **Choice Neighborhood Initiative**
    - \$163.5 million CDBG-DR funds invested in housing, infrastructure and economic development projects in the Iberville-Treme neighborhood



# Road Home Program

## Compliance and Grant Recovery - Updates

- Discussions with HUD re: **self-certification** for reclassification of elevation grants
- **Liaison Services**
  - RFP going out in early September
  - Services to help those homeowners who are reluctant to come in to the Road Home program
  - Will be for the Greater New Orleans area
    - Expandable to other areas as needed
- **Act 801:** Authorizes the City of New Orleans to sell blighted property in the Lower Ninth Ward for a fixed price
- **Act 709:** Road Home grant recovery procedures
