Question: Under FEMA guidelines, self-insurance is an option available only for States. The State must submit an established plan for self-insurance to be approved by FEMA's Assistant Administrator of the Disaster Assistance Directorate. Will the contractor be required to seek and maintain this approval during the contracted period or will the State? If the State, then has the SIR been approved since the last major disaster?

The State's insurance program is not considered a self-insurance program under FEMA guidelines. FEMA has determined that our Self-Insured Retention is a deductible and as such we do not have to submit a self-insurance plan for approval. If by some chance that directive would change, then ORM would seek and maintain the necessary approvals.
