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**STATE ACCEPTING PUBLIC COMMENTS ON ACTION PLAN AMENDMENT FOR
RECOVERY FROM 2020-21 DISASTER EVENTS**

The Louisiana Office of Community Development is accepting public comments on an action plan amendment to spend \$3.1 billion in Community Development Block Grant-Disaster Recovery funding for recovery from Hurricanes Laura, Delta and Ida and the May 2021 Severe Storms. This amendment proposes modifications to program budgets, revisions to a program narrative and the creation of the Homeless and Housing Stability: Affordable Multifamily Rental Housing Development Program. The formal 30-day public comment period begins May 8 and ends at **5 p.m. June 6**.

The **2020-21 Storms APA 5** proposes:

- Modification of program budgets for the Interim Housing Assistance Program and Resilient Mixed Income Gap Funding Program (PRIME);
- Revision of the program narrative for the Resilient Communities Infrastructure Program to include a breakdown of funding allocations by grantee; and
- Creation of the new Homeless and Housing Stability: Affordable Multifamily Rental Housing Development Program, which provides financial support for the rehabilitation and/or construction of multi-family buildings in affected areas to aid households at risk of homelessness or housing instability.

At the end of the official public comment period, the state will submit the action plan amendment to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development for approval.

BACKGROUND: On April 1, 2022, the state published for public comment an initial action plan outlining proposed spending for \$600 million in federal disaster recovery funds for Hurricanes Laura and Delta. The U.S. Dept. of Housing and Urban Development approved the action plan on July 14, 2022. The state published a substantial amendment to that action plan on June 1, 2022, which proposed spending an additional allocation of \$1.27 billion in federal funding for recovery from Hurricane Ida and the May 2021 Severe Storms, along with an additional allocation of \$450 million for Hurricanes Laura and Delta. HUD approved this on Nov. 4, 2022. An additional substantial amendment to the action plan was published on June 7, 2023, for an additional allocation of \$831.5 million for Hurricane Ida and the May 2021 Severe Storms. HUD approved this on Aug. 29, 2023.
