





PROP Awards

Project-Based Recovery Opportunity Program

- 11 Economic Development Projects (9 in New Orleans)
- Awarded \$21.8 Million so far (\$18.55M in New Orleans)
- Will support the creation of 597 jobs
- Provide direct low-interest loans ranging from \$500,000 to \$5 million at a minimum 1% annual interest rate
- Aims to create new jobs in areas affected by hurricanes Katrina and Rita



PROP Awards

Project-Based Recovery Opportunity Program

Emphasized projects that:

- ✓ Create opportunities for new small businesses
- ✓ At least 51% owned by a female or minority
- ✓ Preserve historic structures
- ✓ Provide an essential service to a recovering neighborhood
- ✓ Demonstrated community support
- ✓ Create jobs above program-required minimum for workers with lower incomes or
- ✓ Have a positive repayment history with OCD-DRU



Innovation Awards

Innovation Loan & Technical Assistance Program

- \$20 million awarded to 20 nonprofit organizations
- Nonprofits will provide low-interest loans and technical assistance to small businesses in hurricane-impacted areas
- \$14.3 million disbursed as low-interest loans
- \$5.7 million used to provide technical assistance
