SUBJECT: CDBG-CV Amendment to FY 2019 Action Plan and Method of Distribution - Notice of

Comment Period

The State of Louisiana has been allocated a total of \$44,336,196 in Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act (CARES Act) Formula Grant funds (\$13,443,720 for CV1, \$18,401,828 for CV2 and \$12,490,648 for CV3). The purpose of this amendment is to reallocate a portion of the prior rounds of CDBG-CV funds.

This amendment proposes to allocate \$8,000,000 to a Non-congregate Shelter (NCS) Program for the acquisition of property to be utilized as non-congregate low barrier shelters for people experiencing homelessness. Non-congregate Shelters provide homeless individuals with private rooms, and this type of sheltering is essential to protect people from COVID-19. This reallocation includes CDBG-CV funds previously allocated to other programs as well as CDBG-CV funds that have been returned.

This amendment also proposes to allow municipalities awarded grants from the HVAC Improvement Program to request additional funding due to the increase in construction costs related to the effects of COVID-19 and the need for additional testing on some facilities. Some of the municipalities have exceeded the maximum grant amount of \$1,000,000 due to increased costs and limited bid responses.

This amendment also proposes to direct \$900,000 in additional funds to public facilities projects in the City of Opelousas.
