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STATE ACCEPTING PUBLIC COMMENTS ON MIT ACTION PLAN AMENDMENT 3 FOR DISTRIBUTION OF FUNDS IN LOUISIANA WATERSHED INITIATIVE

The Louisiana Office of Community Development is accepting public comments on an action plan amendment that will modify the amounts and method of distribution for Community Development Block Grant disaster recovery funds in several programs of the Louisiana Watershed Initiative. The 30-day public comment period starts today and ends at **5 p.m. Thursday, Sept. 7, 2023.**

Mitigation APA 3 makes the following LWI program changes:

- LWI Local and Regional Watershed Projects and Programs: Due to inflation, Round 3 will be eliminated and funds for Rounds 1 and 2 will be increased up to 20% for awarded projects. Because of these anticipated increases, the maximum award for all projects in Rounds 1 and 2 will be increased from \$10 million to \$20 million.
- **LWI State Projects and Programs:** \$15 million earmarked for the State Economic Development and Resilience program will be moved into the State Infrastructure and Housing program.
- LWI Non-Federal Cost Share Assistance: \$15 million earmarked for state and federal matching funds in response to Hurricanes Laura and Delta will be eliminated, as the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development subsequently awarded additional allocations specific to these hurricanes.
- **LWI Region 9 Allocation:** \$100 million will be allocated from Local and Regional Projects and Programs to LWI Region 9, which includes all or part of the following parishes: Ascension, East Baton Rouge, East Feliciana, Iberville, Livingston, St. Helena and St. James. As a result of the Great Floods of 2016, 74% of damaged households were in one of these seven parishes.

This amendment is considered substantial because it includes a change in benefit for Local and Regional Projects and Programs. Substantial amendments require a public comment period.

After accepting public comments, the state will submit the plan to HUD for final federal approval. Once HUD approves the plan, the state will be able implement the proposed changes.
