

## Summary

The Louisiana budget, like every other U.S. state budget and many local budgets, relies on money from the federal government. These federal dollars flow into Louisiana in 4 basic ways:

- Federal dollars in the Louisiana budget which fund public assistance programs such as: Medicaid, Temporary Assistance to Needy Families (TANF), Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP), and Community Development Block Grants.
- Direct benefits from the federal government paid to individuals through such programs as Social Security and Medicare benefits, food stamps, unemployment benefits and federal education assistance like Pell Grants.
- Payment to vendors to perform federal contracts in Louisiana.
- Salaries paid to federal employees working in Louisiana

This annual report (FY2014) reports on federal dollars received by Louisiana State agencies from federal grants.

In state fiscal year (FY) 2014, Louisiana received funding from a total of 813 grant programs for a total of \$12,066,827,059 in grant funds. Some grant programs had multiple state agencies as recipients for a total of 1020 grantees within the 813 programs.

All state agencies were ranked depending on the total federal grant funding received. The top ten (10) agencies received \$11,311,463,521 federal grant funds amounting to 93.74% of all federal grant funds received by the State of Louisiana. The Louisiana Department of Health and Hospitals (DHH) was the number one federal grant funds recipient with \$5,326,869,276 or 44.14% of total grant funds to Louisiana. Within DHH, and the State of Louisiana, the Medical Assistance Program (Medicaid) was the major awardee of federal grant funds; Medicaid accounted for 39.87% of state federal grant funds received and 90.32% of DHH grant awards equivalent to \$4,811,325,961. Table 1 presents the top 10 federally funded Louisiana departments.

The federal grant data provided in this report was provided by the recipient Louisiana departments and offices including public higher education institutions. Additional supporting information was ascertained from the Catalog of Federal Domestic Assistance (CFDA) website, Grants.gov website, and many of the federal agencies associated with origination of funds.

Most federal grants are identified by a Catalog of Federal Domestic Assistance (CFDA) number which is assigned by the federal government. CFDA numbers are included throughout this Annual Report. The first two digits identify the federal agency from which the grant originates. The next three digits identify the specific grant with each agency. The legend below helps identify the federal grant funding sources by CFDA number. State agencies often obtain funding from multiple federal agencies:

93.586 State Court Improvement Program

**Program Description:** - The program provides three grant opportunities to State courts to improve court efficiency and the quality of legal representation; a basic grant for assessment work; a grant for data collection and analysis; and a grant to increase training of court personnel, including cross training with agency staff. The program provides State courts flexibility to design assessments which identify barriers to timely and effective decision-making, highlight practices which are not fully successful, examine areas they find to be in need of correction or added attention, and then implement reforms which address the State courts specific needs. State courts are required to collaborate with the State child welfare agency and Tribes in this work. The Child and Family Services Improvement and Innovation Act (P.L. 112-34) of 2011, reauthorized all three Court Improvement Program (CIP) grants through fiscal year (FY) 2016. The Act added provisions encouraging State courts to promote the use of concurrent planning and increases and improve engagement of the entire family in court processes relating to child welfare, family preservation, family reunification and adoption. The Act also allocated one million dollars to establish a Tribal Court Improvement Program.
