SUBJECT: Reimbursement of Overtime for Hurricane Katrina

The Division of Administration has received several questions regarding the memorandum dated September 6, 2005, on the subject of coding of expenditures and tracking lost revenues related to Hurricane Katrina. This directive is being issued to address questions regarding the payment and reimbursement of overtime related to Katrina.

The Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) has advised that they will not reimburse the cost of overtime related to Katrina if a pre-disaster policy does not pay employees for overtime. However, if a pre-disaster local or state provision exists to pay overtime during emergency situations, FEMA will reimburse the cost of overtime. FEMA will not reimburse for the value of compensatory leave earned. If an agency would have normally compensated employees at the straight time rate, and elects to compensate at the 1.5 rate for overtime related to the hurricane, it is unlikely that the full amount will be reimbursed.

Agency personnel should ensure their operational budgets cover any overtime costs incurred that may not be reimbursed by FEMA.

Supporting documentation for payment of overtime must be maintained and provided to FEMA upon request.
